JAN OVE EKEBERG

is Adolf H. Lindstrøm's biographer and have written the texts for a new exhibition about Amundsen's life and expeditions: "Dream big thoughts - reach high goals", at Amundsens birthplace, *Tomta*, near Fredrikstad.

Ekeberg has written 20 books altogether. He is a former TV-anchorman, now a full time author.

His suspense series about the last viking king of Norway, Harald Hardrada, has won a wide readership.



JOHN GEIGER, CM

is the international bestselling author of seven books, including *Frozen in Time: The Fate of the Franklin Expedition*, and *The Third Man Factor: Surviving the Impossible.* His work has been translated into fourteen languages. The chief executive officer of the

Royal Canadian Geographical Society, Geiger graduated in history from the University of Alberta and holds an honorary Doctor of Laws from the University of Calgary. He is recipient of both the Polar Medal and the Order of Canada.



GEIR O. KLØVER

Geir has been the director of the Fram Museum since 2005. Since then, the museum has undergone a total renovation and modernisation process and stands today as an exciting award winning museum with attractions for all ages.

Geir has edited or written more than 20 books on Norwegian polar expeditions, including the personal diaries of the crew members on Fridtjof Nansen's and Roald Amundsen's expeditions to the Arctic and Antarctic. His book Lessons from the Arctic - How Roald Amundsen Won the race to the South Pole (2017) was awarded at the biannual William Mill's Polar Book Prize as one of the three best polar books in the world 2016-2018. His latest book The *Nansen Photographs* tells the story of The First Fram Expedition 1893-96 through all recovered photos taken during the expedition. The book will also be published in Russian in 2022.



FRIDTJOF MEHLUM

holds a Dr. Philos. degree in marine ecology from the University of Oslo. He has 20 years of experience from the polar areas as a researcher with the Norwegian Polar Institute. Later, he worked as a special adviser at the Research Council of Norway as an administrator of polar and climate research. Before he retired, he served for 10 years as the research director of the Natural History Museum in Oslo. Fridtjof is also president of the Norwegian Polar Club and is a co-editor of the Club's yearbook *Polarboken*, in which he contributes with his own papers, mainly on polar history.



ØYVIND NORDSLETTEN

joined the Norwegian Foreign Service in 1974 and served in various postings, including 9 years as ambassador to Russia from 2000 - 2008. In the 1990-ies he was his country's first envoy to Ukraine and established the Norwegian embassy in Kyiv. He also worked as ambassador to Ireland, consul general in Murmansk and director general of the International department at the Prime Minister's office in Oslo. During his lengthy stays in Russia Mr. Nordsletten travelled extensively to many regions, including Siberia and other areas associated with Fridtjof Nansen.



MIKROFILM

Mikrofilm is a Norwegian Oscar winning production house and animation studio, currently in production with the most ambitious Norwegian animated feature of all times: *Titina*, directed by Kajsa Næss, scheduled for release autumn 2022.
