TOR BOMANN-LARSEN

Tor Bomann-Larsen (b. 1951) is one of Norway's sharpest and most important contemporary writers. He has published picture books, comics, essays, political satire and a historical novel.

He has garnered the greatest recognition for his biographies, not least the monumental work about King Haakon VII and his time. His book on Roald Amundsen was published in 1995. The eighth and final volume of the work about Haakon & Maud and their contemporaries was launched in autumn 2019 to rave reviews. Bomann-Larsen has received the Brage prize and a number of other awards.

KEVIN KENNY

As a teenager, the fortunate purchase of a second hand copy of *Treasure Island* containing a postcard from Ernest Shackleton ignited Kevin's interest in the iconic polar explorer. Shackleton has been an easy travelling companion since, and has materialised on the most surprising occasions.

From Co. Kildare, Ireland and close to where Shackleton was born, Kevin is a board member of the Shackleton Museum in Athy. He is one of the organisers of the annual Shackleton Autumn School, and has contributed to a range of projects aimed at raising awareness of Shackleton and his achievements.

Kevin is always enthusiastic to share his discovery of Shackleton with others.



KLAUS DODDS

Klaus is Professor of Geopolitics and Executive Dean of the School of Life Sciences and Environment at Royal Holloway University of London.

Klaus has written and edited a series of books that consider the polar regions, ice studies and contemporary geopolitics. The most recent include an edited collection called *Ice Humanities* (with Sverker Sorlin, Manchester University Press 2022) and one on Border Wars (Penguin 2022). His work has been translated into many languages including Chinese, Japanese, Korean, Russian and Spanish. Beyond the academy he has worked for the British Parliament as a specialist adviser to various select committees on the Arctic and is a visiting professor at the College of Europe in Warsaw. He is an Hon. Fellow of British Antarctic Survey.



BEAU RIFFENBURGH

Beau Riffenburgh is a historian of exploration, particularly that of the polar regions. After earning his doctorate at the University of Cambridge, he served for 15 years as the Editor of Polar Record and the head of the Polar History Group at the Scott Polar Research Institute. His books include The Myth of the Explorer, a critically acclaimed examination of exploration and the popular press; Nimrod, the account of Ernest Shackleton's heroic attempt on the South Pole; and Aurora, the authoritative study of Douglas Mawson's Australasian Antarctic Expedition. He was also editor of the award-winning Encyclopedia of the Antarctic, and has written 10 books for the Fram Museum. In conjunction with mystery writer Susanna Gregory, he has published 12 novels, including The Nimrod Murders, based around the refitting of Shackleton's ship prior to his first Antarctic expedition, and The Killing Ship, a modern Antarctic eco-thriller.



DONALD LAMONT

Donald graduated in Russian Studies from Aberdeen University. After four years in the British motor industry (British Leyland) 1970-74, he joined Her Majesty's Diplomatic Service, serving from 1974 to 2006. He had postings in Austria, the Soviet Union, Berlin (through the Fall of the Wall), and on secondment to the Office of the High Representative in Bosnia & Herzegovina. His first Head of Mission appointment was as Ambassador to Uruguay (1991-94).

In 1999 Donald was appointed Governor of the Falkland Islands and Commissioner for South Georgia and the South Sandwich Islands, serving until 2002. He subsequently served three years (2003-2006) in Caracas as Ambassador to Venezuela. After retirement he was appointed Chief Executive of Wilton Park (2007-2009).



DR JOHN SHEARS

Dr John Shears is a veteran polar geographer and expedition leader. He has over 30 years of experience of working in both Antarctica and the Arctic, first with the British Antarctic Survey, then the Scott Polar Research Institute at the University of Cambridge, and now running his own polar consultancy business Shears Polar Limited.

Since 2017, John's polar expeditions have focussed on the search for Shackleton's Endurance. He was the leader of the Weddell Sea Expedition in 2019, and then led the Endurance22 mission, which discovered the famous ship on 5 March 2022.

John was awarded the Polar Medal by Her Majesty the Queen in 2019 in recognition of his "outstanding achievement and service to the United Kingdom in the field of polar research".



NICO VINCENT

Nico is a Subsea engineer, surveyor and AUV/ROV manager. He managed the COMEX Marine Operations Department in the 1990's for over 15 years. He then joined Subsea Resources PLC, specializing in Ultra deep-water salvage as Operations Manager. With his 30 years experience, Nico is today Deep Ocean Search Ltd Operations Manager and is qualified to carry out any unusual special subsea projects.



JOANNI AND TRINA SALLERINA

Joanni and Trina are retired teachers from Gjoa Haven, Nunavut. Joanni is the former Mayor, having served three terms for the Hamlet of Gjoa Haven. They were both in charge of the Gjoa Haven Norway Group, organizing a trip to the Fram Museum for a group of local youth. The group performed traditional drum dancing and games at the Fram Museum and visited *Gjøa*, the ship that their community is named after. Joanni performed for H.M. King Harald and former Prime Minster Jens Stoltenberg during the opening of the Gjøa Building in 2013. Trina initiated the return of a number of historical artifacts brought to Norway by Roald Amundsen from the Cultural History Museum in Oslo to the Nattilik Heritage Centre in Gjoa Haven.
